Conditions of Sale

1. The auction is offered as a service to members in order to contribute to keeping tools within the coppice industry, but may include items other than tools.
2. By entering a lot you confirm that you have title to the goods or have authority to sell them
3. A non-refundable lotting fee of 50p will be charged for each item entered into the auction at point of entry. This fee is to cover expenses. Any profit will be transferred to funds to run the Gathering.
4. As has become normal practise, in coppice group auctions, NCFed and HCCG act as facilitators, putting buyers and sellers into contact. Once a bid has been accepted, details of the price agreed by the highest bidder will be handed to the seller and they are responsible for completion of the transaction. Once a bid has been made, the bidder is bound to honour that bid. The seller or their agent are expected to be on site at the time of the auction.
5. All items remain the property of the vendor until payment is agreed between the purchaser and vendor or their agents. The lot is at the vendors risk prior to the fall of the hammer and the purchasers risk after.
6. Each purchaser shall give his or her name and contact details and pay the full purchase money at the close of sale.
7. The Auctioneer has described the lots to the best of his ability and belief from the information furnished by the seller or their agent. The vendor who supplies such statements is alone responsible for any error or mis-statement which there may be. The Auctioneers reserve the right to refuse a lot both on description and sight of the lot.
8. The lots sold are sold as seen with all faults, imperfections and errors of description, and purchasers are advised to inspect the lots before the sale commences.
9. No lot/s shall be removed from the premises until paid for.
